Monterey Police Department (MPD) Highlights  
April 2017

NARRATIVE

- The Monterey Police Department (MPD) conducted an operation that targeted Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) licensed businesses that may sell alcohol to persons under 21. Three individuals were cited for furnishing alcohol to persons under 21. MPD also conducted Informed Merchants Preventing Alcohol-Related Crime Tendencies (IMPACT) inspections. The inspections focused on licensee education. The overtime costs incurred for these operations were reimbursed with Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control grant funds.
- PRVNT arrested a subject involved in numerous bike and auto thefts on the peninsula. One stolen bicycle, two stolen vehicles, narcotics, and a handgun were recovered.
- PRVNT arrested a subject who was threatening and stalking a Seaside Police Officer.
- An investigation conducted by a Monterey Police Officer, PRVNT, and Monterey Police Investigations led to the arrest of four individuals involved in numerous burglaries and identity thefts on the peninsula.
- A Police Services Technician (PST) was instrumental in the identification and arrest of an identity theft suspect. The PST was able to connect a phone query with a photo of the suspect, which led to the suspect's identification.
- MPD officers arrested four juvenile suspects and obtained confessions related to a residential burglary that also led to the return of the stolen property.
- MPD Proactive Specified Foot Patrol – April 2017 (does not include calls-for-service)
  - Alvarado Street (31) Foot Patrols
  - Cannery Row (17) Foot Patrols
  - Wharf 1 (12) Foot Patrols
- Staffing
  - Staffing continues to be a priority for the MPD. The MPD consistently has between 10-20% of the sworn workforce not fully functioning (injured, ill, training, vacation). Fifty-one sworn is the number that should be fully functional, an increase of 10-20% (5-10 additional sworn officers) would account for personnel that are not fully functional.
  - Sworn (as of 04/30/17)
    - 51 authorized (-3 unfilled / -3 extended leave / -1 modified duty / -2 training / -3 academy - 24%)
  - Non-Sworn (as of 04/30/17)
    - 19 authorized (-1 CSO / -1 AAll extended leave – 11%)

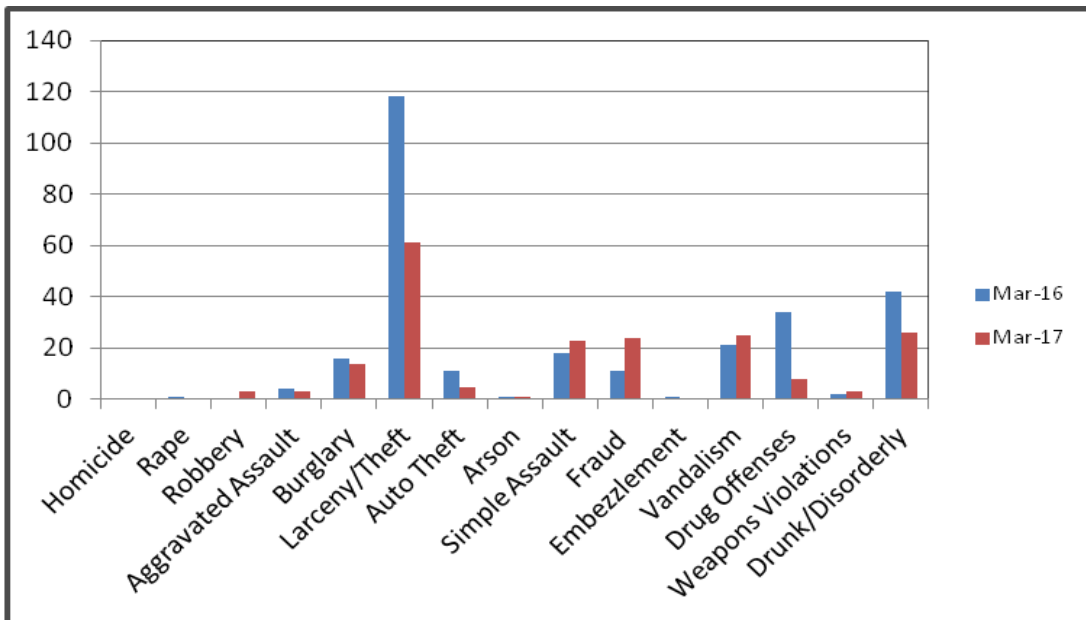


Table B – 2016 Monthly Average v. March 2017
