

Sketch of Larkin pier and Custom House with Monterey Redoubt (fort) visible on hill, 1847.
















A group of Monterey's "sport fishermen," hold salmon caught in Monterey Bay, 1900. Within a few years, after fishermen switched their fishing methods to trolling lines, large numbers of salmon were landed in Monterey. Because of these large salmon landings, a man named Frank E. Booth arrived in Monterey to open a salmon cannery. Booth also noticed the large numbers of sardines running in the bay in the fall and winter. He thought, "I can do something with that."







Early View of Sicilian Fishermen Unloading Sardines at Booth's Cannery, 1909. Salmon processors on the Sacramento River heard of the amazing catches in Monterey and sent Frank E. Booth to investigate. Booth built a small shed near the Monterey Wharf for salmon processing, and began experimenting with the plentiful large sardine or pilchard appearing in the bay beginning in the late summer and early fall months. In 1900, H. R. Robbins leased a small piece of property right in front of Booth's shed at the foot of Monterey Wharf. Robbins may have been a wide-ranging businessman, for his lease stated that he operated a "sardine cannery, reduction plant and dance hall." Booth bought him out in 1903, and took over his sardine cannery. Because the large sardine was not immediately accepted, Booth promoted sales by variously advertising them as "Soused Monterey Mackerel," or "Salmon" and "Herring" sardines. They were sardines, whatever they were called.

Japanese Salmon Boats unloading at the Wharf, 1909. After the United States imposed the Chinese Exclusion Act in 1882, Japanese immigrants to the West Coast increased. One of those immigrants was Otosaburo Noda who settled in Watsonville in 1895. One day, while working in Monterey as a lumberjack for the Pacific Improvement Company (precursor of the Pebble Beach Company), Noda noticed the incredible variety of fish and red abalone in the Monterey Bay, and that nobody was utilizing this resource! Leaving his lumberjacking, he moved to Monterey and started a small fishing colony consisting of several fishermen from Wakayama, Japan.





At the end of that 1909 salmon season, the salmon season lasted just three months, May 15-August 15, the Monterey Daily Cypress reported that there were 185 salmon boats fishing the Monterey Bay, 145 of those boats were Japanese owned. That 1909 season, over 1 million five-hundred thousand pounds of salmon were caught and brought into Monterey!









From the Roof of Booth's Cannery. This wonderful panoramic image was taken at the end of the salmon season in 1919. Those are mostly salmon boats in the water. Fisherman's Wharf began over 100 years ago, when it was built by the Pacific Steamship Company whose steam schooners plied up and down the California coast with passengers and cargoes of lumber, tanbark, canned fish and occasionally Chinese squid. The City of Monterey took over the wharf during the early fishing industry. The old wharf became the headquarters for the wholesale fish shippers and the sardine fishing fleet. The wharf at the far right is for the Hotel Del Monte and Bathhouse. There was a wooden sidewalk that took you from the hotel all the way to the foot of the Monterey wharf.







Past. Present. and Future. This is Monterey's past present and future in the fishing industry, in 1930. The three boats in the foreground are (L to R): lampara, ring boat or Japanese round-haul, and a new purse seiner. Purse seiner refers to the type of net used. In the background are two new purse seiners with turntables for the net. The purse seiner first made its appearance on the Monterey Bay in 1926. The fishermen in Monterey were resistant to move to these big boats primarily due to the cost. The lampara, fully rigged and ready to in 1930, cost about A new purse seiner fully rigged and ready to go, cost about \$30,000, not including the net which was another \$10-15,000! Eventually most fishermen used the big purse seiners. The obtained loans from the diesel engine companies and from the Bank of Italy, now the Bank of America.






















































